Rationale Year 11 is designed to fine tune skills learned in year 10 while simultaneously increasing the complexity of their writing and speaking work. . Key skills such as listening, reading, memorisation, translation, coping with complex texts and unfamiliar language as well as developing fluency in speaking and writing about a variety of topics are regularly developed and consolidated in lessons and homeworks. Course content learning continues with topics such as holidays and school. Students will have two mock speaking exams before their GCSE speaking in April.				GCSE exams: Speaking Listening Reading Writing	Continues to build upon key skills and topics studied at KS3 and year 10. Past paper practice prepares students for the real GCSE exams.	Students should have a clear understanding of the format of each GCSE paper and what key skills are needed. They should be able to write and comfortably talk about any topics in Theme 1 + 2 + 3.
