Flashcards: write a question

on one side e.g. *what are the qualities of*

God in Christianity and

the answers on the other side e.g. *omnipotent, omniscient, omnibenevolent.*



Mind Maps: Create a mind map for each unit e.g. put Islam Beliefs in the center of the page,

then have beliefs such

tawhid and afterlife

branching off and

then have religious

teachings on tawhid

and afterlife branching off further.



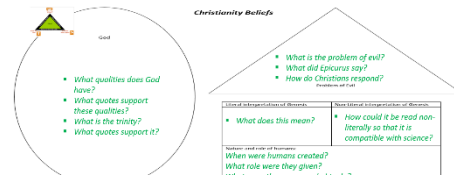
Crib Sheets: Divide a plain piece of paper into sections, one for each key topic e.g. For Christianity Practices it should be divided into sections

for worship,

sacraments,

pilgrimage,

celebrations, Christianity in Britain, Worldwide church. Then add everything you know on the topic in the section, including facts, quotes etc.



for revision

- Focus on the topics you find most difficult first.

- Go back and check what you have missed out and add it in a green pen .
- Condense these notes onto flashcards/ mindmaps or crib sheets.
